




Once ashore we all repaired to the nearby restaurant for a wonderful seafood lunch, followed by a gentle amble across the island to the Tycho








A gentle sail home brought us back to harbour about 8 pm ready for a relaxing evening prior to the formal AGM on Sunday morining.
